(Jesus) said to them, "Therefore every teacher of the law who has become a disciple in the kingdom of heaven is like the owner of a house who brings out of his storeroom new treasures as well as old" (Matthew 13:52).

Dear Friends,

In our first two months of life together, I have celebrated *your* story here at Fairhope UMC, and consider myself exceedingly blessed to now be a part of what is to be *our* story in the future. I give thanks for the fervent wind of the Spirit that has blown through our recent fellowship, rustling and turning the pages of our next chapter. With each new experience of worship, God's word through Isaiah comes to mind: *I am about to do a new thing; now it springs forth, do you not perceive it?* (43:19).

I am so excited to be here. I also recognize that our perceptions of what God is up to in the world can be as diverse as we are. Thus, and rightfully so, the discovery of next steps will take time and prayerful discernment. So far we have explored what it might mean for us "to love boldly, casting the light of Jesus into the world," but where will *our* story lead *us? What now?*

At best, I hear the question with the joy of anticipation, as if to say, "I can't wait to see what is next!" Unfortunately, however, that same question may also be rephrased out of anxiety and with a sense of dread. You can hear this tone in the fearful echoes of ancient Israel as they navigated the unchartered wilderness of their own existence: so where do we go from here? In response, God gave them (and us) this blessed assurance: as I was with Moses, so I will be with you. I will not fail you or forsake you (Joshua 1:5).

And so it is that God has promised to hold our past, our present, and our future together. Beyond the limitations of time and space, how marvelous it is that the love of God is available at all times and in all places! As John Wesley proclaimed, since God is "from everlasting to everlasting" (Ps. 90:2), the only thing that divides the past from the future is *now*. It sounds small in light of eternity, but the "here and now" is of great importance, said Wesley, as it is the given arena for decision and discipleship. It is also the time and place of *our* story; as a particular expression of the body of Christ.

So what do we do now? To prepare us for this continuing conversation of faith, our next worship series will be geared toward the task of **Reclaiming Our Roots.** In a culture that is either overly conditioned by the frailties of human emotion, or divided by the absolutist extremes of those "in the know," I look forward to mining the vast resources of John and Charles Wesley, whose conjunctive approach to theology is indeed a rare jewel in this day and age.

Consider this appetizer...

"Perhaps the church today can learn new things from John Wesley. People, even the born-again kind, are notoriously weak at holding together paradoxes which belong together—like the Spirit and the Word, the private and the social, or 'things old and new' (Mt. 13:52). Yet true renewal in the church always weds new insights, ideas and methods with the best elements from history. And true renewal is always a return, at the most basic level, to the ideal of the church as presented in Scripture and as lived out in a varying mosaic of faithfulness and unfaithfulness down through history. John Wesley represents an intriguing synthesis of old and new, conservative and radical, tradition and innovation that can spark greater clarity in today's new quest to be radically Christian."

I do wonder what lessons this 18th century Anglican priest might have for us. Where is this going? Come and see!

Can't make it out to the Great White Way this year? Not a problem. Our choirs are bringing a little bit of Broadway to you this month! Live in our Christian Life Center on September 15 our music ministries will be presenting The Best of Broadway. The concert will be a retrospect of Broadway through the years going back to the golden age of the Broadway musical to more recent hits like Wicked. Our concert will feature many selections from favorites through the years including Singin' In the Rain, Chicago, Nunsense, Joseph and the Amazing Technicolor Dreamcoat, Guys and Dolls and many more. This has been a great opportunity to allow the choir to come together and perform quite a different style than they may be used to as well as a chance to bring in more of our youth and add a few more members to our choir family. You will also have the pleasure of seeing many of our church members stepping out into the solo spotlight such as Joe Bullington, Carrie French, Kristi Hagood, Carolyn Kidd and Susan Grace. Broadway is one of the few truly American art forms in music and theater and traces all the way back to 1750 when Thomas Kean and Walter Murray opened a theater company on Nassau Street. This theater was large enough to hold 280 patrons and typically put on Shakespearian plays and ballad operas. Broadway refers to a location found in the theater district located in Manhattan in New York City. Many refer to Broadway as the "Great White Way." This is due to the fact that the famous Broadway electric signs began with The Red Mill Theater as the first show with its own sign. White lights were used as colored bulbs burned out very quickly, providing the nickname "The Great White Way". It was in the roaring twenties when many of the most well-known musical composers created shows. Some of the most well known include Cole Porter, George Gershwin, Vincent Youmans, Jerome Kern, Noel Coward and Rodgers and Hart. Show Boat was the show that allowed drama to come back to Broadway as it had a completely integrated score and book that was all based on dramatic themes. After the Great Depression, Broadway entered its golden age with many blockbuster hits running for more than a thousand shows. Oklahoma! is one of the longest-running musicals with 2,212 performances! Now that we are all experts, come and join us for a night of fun, song and fellowship! See you there!
